Subject: Rocky Flats Stewardship Council, (Public Comment Period).

Since 1951,
It has been repeatedly and continues to be a serious concern of the citizens in the surrounding Communities of Rocky Flats Wildlife Refuge, concerning the **unacceptable and inappropriate cleanup of the (Toxic and Hazardous Waste on the (RF) plant site**, that was leached, sprayed, buried, also the imploding of the contaminated tunnels and under ground building levels contaminated with high levels of Plutonium and other hazardous materials on the Rocky Flats Plant Site, leaving nothing more, than a toxic contaminated cesspool for future generations.

Historically, the over site of the Department of Energy (DOE), the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, (CDPHE)' and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), have known and allowed the activity of all former Rocky Flats, (RF) Plant Contractors to continue (**repeated environmental violations**) and **Exposures to the Employees, (please note), This arena still exists today with Disseminating false information (Tours) and the intent to educate other groups and individuals that Rocky Flats Plant Site is safe.**

Let us put this in a different perspective, (**if Known**), any potential citizen were repeatedly disposing of toxic and hazardous waste resulting in Environmental Contamination, (**take your best guess**) of what the consequences may be to the individuals if the following examples were known, disposing of Toxic and Hazardous Materials in the communities in the State of Colorado and repeatedly allowed to do the same under these same circumstances, would (DOE) (CDPHE) and (EPA) **turn heads the other way as they have at (RF)**, allowing Citizens in the State of Colorado to do the same,

- A: Dispose of automotive drain oil and antifreeze in the street culvert or back yard.
- B: Dispose of toxic paint solutions in the same manner.
- C: Dispose of toxic and hazardous materials on the State of Colorado (COPHE) premises.
- D: Remove all automotive emission control systems on their vehicles.
- E: Dispose of any electronic components known to contain hazardous toxic materials.
- F: Disposing illegally, (Asbestos), required to be removed from demolition or removal of asbestos in older homes.
- G: Disposing illegally, of any Toxic or Hazardous materials illegally on any land in the State of Colorado, **other than the Rocky Flats Plant Site as it was allowed in the Past.**

The Candelas subdivision at the south end of the (RF) buffer zone is also of great concern with young family children and parents having future health issues resulting from their long term exposures to the toxic and hazardous materials remaining on the pant site.

It has been approximately 64 years of lessons learned at Rocky Flats, resulting in many former workers that have serious health issues, Cancer, Chronic Beryllium Disease, Asbestoses and other health issues related to their exposures at the plant site.

It strongly suggests and appears that the expanding housing developments near and around the (Contaminated Plant Site), and individuals attempting to educate others that there is no future health concerns, and the Plant Site is Safe, **(please note)**, this concept is driven by financial gain, fat pay checks, and not in the best interest of the health and safety of future generations.
