The Rocky Flats Citizens Advisory Board has reviewed the June 7, 2004 letter from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the Rocky Flats Cleanup Agreement (RFCA) Parties pertaining to its recommendation on demarcation of DOE retained lands at Rocky Flats. The Board also has reviewed the DOE response dated June 23, 2004 and notes that DOE supports the concept of constructing a four-strand barbed wire stock fence on the boundary of the DOE retained lands. As for the other recommendations made by Fish and Wildlife, the Board notes DOE intends to use them as a basis for further discussions with the public and regulatory agencies.

Based on its review of the letter by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Rocky Flats Citizens Advisory Board fully supports the recommendations found therein, and urges their adoption by DOE and the other RFCA Parties.
